Safety Note:
Paddlers should take every precaution to minimize risk when exploring this beautiful shoreline. Sudden and severe weather conditions can very quickly affect your safety. Even though the majority of the Bay is relatively shallow, strong winds can create large waves and dangerous paddling conditions. Life jackets are required by law in Michigan for all watercraft users and it is always a good idea to buddy up with others for your journey. Carry personal safety gear including emergency locator beacons or flares, a fully-charged cell phone in a ziplock bag or waterproof container, a dry bag with a change of warm clothes, a powerful flashlight (or two), and food and water. Call 911 in an emergency situation and be prepared to wait for a response.
